How would you feel if you weren’t allowed to go to school?	Why is it important that the girls take action, even when they are struggling themselves?	Do you believe that young people can make a difference? How?
Why do you think the Taliban forbid girls from going to school?	How do you think the girls in Kabul feel when they listen to the radio broadcasts?	What can we learn from the girls in London?
What can people in Denmark do to support girls’, women’s and humans’ rights around the world?	What message would you like to send to a girl in Kabul?	What are some small things you can do that might make a difference for others?
